

President's Report

Ladies and Gentlemen - Specifier beware is the name of this article. As you all know we have spent a good deal of time as the Boston Chapter board trying to obtain information about Code changes in the plumbing code. Now we all know that the Plumbing Board are a bunch of hard working individuals with a lot of projects on their plate so this article is not an indictment of The Plumbing Board. However we as a society need to keep each other informed about items which may affect our clients. For this reason I will share with you an experience I ran into during a recent project.

Now I am not going to mention specific names. However it is a troublesome situation I was put in. It reinforces that we must watch for and react to issues during the design period and not have them occur during the construction period as this issue did.

This project has a toilet room and it will be seeing a lot of traffic and abuse so our client wanted Stainless fixtures. Their reasoning as you was correct.. Stainless Steel fixtures will hold up better than China. So, I specified a Stainless steel urinal on a project I am working on. This particular urinal was listed as an approved product on the Massachusetts Plumbing Boards website. The parties involved believed all the I's were dotted and the t's were crossed with this design.

I was quite surprised however, when I received an email stating that the inspector had been through the project and stated the urinals could not be installed. He stated they did not meet code and even if they were approved and on the website they could not be used on the project. Also they will be removed from the Product approved list. So the next day I made a trip to the site to access the situation. I walked thru the Toilet room in question. On the floor turned upside down was the urinal. Laying on it was the $1\,\%$ brass p-trap that was to be attached to the urinal. During the inspectors walk thru I believe the urinal was probably in the same position and the inspector noticed the trap was not integral as the code requires.

After a number of phone calls between me and the factory representative and an in depth look into the State board approval list I found a few discrepancies that all engineers should be aware of. For instances, not only are there stainless steel urinals that have separate traps there are also Trough type Stainless steel urinals. These too I am under the impression are a unit we are not allowed to specify anymore.

So back to my point, specifier beware. It now seems that even though a part is on the approval list you have to do due diligence and look into any possible problems which might arise. We as a society must help each other out. We need to make other chapter members aware of issues we may have run into so that we can avoid expensive change orders. Unfortunately The Contracting section of this equation will back charge our clients for changes we are forced to make.

I know there have been more incidents that have happened to other engineers. I would ask each of you to consider writing an article about you experience so we can educate our members to these pitfalls.

Lastly I have a meeting next week regarding the CPD class I have been writing about. It should be all cemented and I hope to have the class in March.

Technical Report

January Wrap- up

I want to thank Mr. Bob Littman for a thorough review of vacuum systems designs. Bob started out the presentation with an overview of the fundamentals of vacuum units of measure. He described the importance of understanding how the vacuum system is to be utilized by your clients and the relationship of knowing if certain gases or solvents are to be present in the system. This knowledge will dictate the selection of the appropriate pumps. He went further to describe in detail the various pumping technologies available today and the changes in particular pump systems in response to conservation initiatives.

I would like to refer you to the October, 2010 issue of Plumbing Systems and Design (PS&D) for an in depth approach to vacuum system design.

February Technical Topic & Speaker

The topic for our February Meeting will be:

"Gas Purging - What Went Wrong and What's Coming".

Synopsis: While purging new fuel gas piping prior to start-up has been a routine event, recent incidents involving multiple injuries and fatalities have put the spotlight on purging and how to prevent future incidents. The talk will cover the significant incidents in North Carolina and Connecticut and discuss code revisions being enacted. A brief overview of the National Fuel Gas Code and upcoming code changes will also be included.

Our guest speaker is Mr. Ted Lemoff. Ted has just recently retired Principal from NFPA. While at NFPA he was the expert engineer for many things including NFPA 54 and NFPA 58. Ted has also narrated many safety videos and topics while at NFPA.

The basis of this topic is based on recent events in which the purging of natural piping created catastrophic damage and, sadly, multiple fatalities. As a result of the investigation by authorities the means and methods of purging of natural gas piping systems is to be addressed in upcoming code revisions. This issue is critical to installers, to manufacturers and to engineers alike. Please take the time to attend this informative session.


Future Items
